












# **Lutheran World Relief School Kit Project**

Education is one of the strongest tools a community has for breaking the cycle of poverty. Ensuring that girls attend school, especially in places where their access is deprioritized, has even stronger results. Lutheran World Relief School Kits contain essential supplies to help children — and in some cases, adults — continue learning in the face of serious obstacles. That learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities.



#### **School Supply Collection**

The Outreach Ministry group is sponsoring the Lutheran World Relief School Kit Project. School supplies will be continue to be collected for the project throughout the month of August. Items needed:

- 70-80 sheet one subject spiral notebooks wide or college ruled (4/bag = 600 notebooks)
- 12 inch ruler (1/bag = 150 rulers)
- 1- one hole manual pencil sharpener (1/bag = 150 sharpener)
- 1 pair blunt safety scissors (1/bag = 150 scissors)
- 5-# 2 pencils unsharpened (5/bag = 750 pencils)
- 5 black/blue ballpoint pens, no gel ink (5/bag = 750 pens)
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons (1 box/bag = 150 crayon boxes)
- 1 -2.5 inch eraser (1/bag = 150 pink erasers)

Donations may be left in tubs in the Fellowship Lounge and Atrium. Cash donations would also be gladly received. Monetary donations may be given to ushers at worship or the church office during the week.

# FROM THE PARISH NURSE, LORI REIMER **Walking for Health Benefits**

One of the easiest exercises with many health benefits is walking.

Some of those benefits include:

- · Strengthening your heart and improving circulation. This decreases your risk for both coronary disease and strokes.
- · Burning calories which helps with maintenance or loss of weight. It may additionally help with lowering of blood sugar.
- · Helping to protect your joints by bringing oxygen and nutrients to the area. It also strengthens the muscles that support those joints.
- · Improving your mood, decreasing anxiety, and boosting your self-esteem. In addition, it can help improve your daily sleep and decrease mental decline.

To ensure your safety when walking outside always try to walk in areas designated for pedestrians that are well lit. If walking outside in the early morning or evening, wear reflective clothing and carry a light. Wear sunscreen in the sunlight and stay hydrated. Sturdy shoes with good support and loose, comfortable clothing are also important for safe, easier walking. If you have any health concerns, be sure to check with your health care team before starting any exercise program, including walking.
