

As we enter the fall season, it is a good time to reconnect and refocus our sense of community and the new opportunities that are planned for sharing in the work of Christ's church through Salem. This fall, Salem will initiate a Capital Appeal focused on Salem's mission and vision statements. This month, I invite you to ponder with me the first of three key points in Salem's vision for our sense of who we are as people of God together.

Growing People in Christ through:

• Dynamic and meaningful worship and prayer as the vital core fostering our sense of belonging.

After more than two years, and through conversation, prayer, and reflection together, Salem's Council members agreed it was time to add a second time for worship on Sunday mornings. If we are going to be true to who we say we want to become, it is important that we spend time, effort, and resources to create worship opportunities that draw us in and nurture our connection to God and one another. On September 11, a new schedule was introduced which offers numerous gathering experiences at Salem on Sunday mornings: two different worship services, a fellowship hour as well as education for all ages. For generations, Sundays have been set aside as the Lord's Sabbath. As we all know, however, that pattern for individuals and families has changed and Sundays are now spent at ballfields, campgrounds, backyards, work settings, vacation venues, leaving less opportunities to gather in the Lord's house at the same time as was common not all that many years ago.

My questions are: **Does this mean Salem needs to change our focus?** and **Is our sense of belonging being shaped differently and how do we feel about that?**

Later this month, you will begin to receive materials about **Engaging God's Mission: Hope for the Future.** These materials will help you prepare for deeper conversations with one another and guide us in the work that will unfold over the next three years. I see this to be an exciting time, a hopeful time, an engaging time to re-imagine what it means to be the church. **Who will we become? Who will we invite? What will foster our sense of belonging on this journey?** My greatest hope is that we will indeed feel that meaningful worship and prayer is vital to who we are as people of God and will grow our vision to further invite and extend God's kingdom. Please join me in prayerful and hopeful imagination for the work God is calling us to share.

Celebrating Luther's 500-year legacy, Marty explores the history and influence that this theologian's earthshaking writings have had on Christianity and their continued significance for believers today. Martin Luther: A Man Who Changed the World by Paul L. Maier (Children's section - "Martin Luther")


The reformer, Martin Luther, was a powerful, influential man whose personal quest for peace with God launched widespread change in the church and laid a new foundation for society. As a young monk, Luther searched the Scriptures to ease his anxieties about sin and salvation. He became convinced that the Roman Catholic Church had lost sight of its central themes. Luther challenged the church by posting his Ninety-five Theses on the door

of the Wittenberg Church, an act that guaranteed attention. Rome responded quickly, demanding Luther to retract his remarks and eventually declaring him an outlaw. Despite its best efforts, the hierarchy of the church could not suppress Martin Luther. These dramatic events of his life sparked discontent that had been smoldering for centuries. Luther's writings were widely read and accepted as the Renaissance ended and the Reformation began. His words continue to influence the church today as Christians rely on the truth of God's Word.

Eating A Healthy Diet

Eating fruit provides health benefits — people who eat more fruits and vegetables as part of an overall healthy diet are likely to have a reduced risk of some chronic diseases. Fruits provide nutrients vital for health and maintenance of your body

Nutrients

- · Most fruits are naturally low in fat, sodium, and calories. None have cholesterol.
- · Most vegetables are low in fat and calories,
- · Fruits are sources of many essential nutrients that many people don't get enough of, including potassium, dietary fiber, vitamin C, and folate.
- · Vitamin C is important for growth and repair of all body tissues, helps heal cuts and wounds, and keeps teeth and gums healthy. Vitamin C helps your body absorb iron more easily
- · Vegetables are sources of many of the same nutrients as well as Vitamin A. Vitamin A keeps skin and eyes healthy and helps protect against infections.
- · Diets rich in potassium may help to maintain healthy blood pressure. Fruit sources of potassium include bananas, prunes and prune juice, dried peached and apricots, cantaloupe, honeydew melon, orange juice, sapote, jackfruit, guava, and kiwi.
- · Vegetable sources of potassium include sweet and white potatoes, tomato products, lima and kidney beans, soybeans, spinach, and acorn squash.
- · Diet fiber from fruits and vegetables, as part of an overall healthy diet, helps reduce blood cholesterol levels and may lower risk of heart disease. Fiber is important for proper bowel function.
