# Salem Book Club

Salem's Book Club will meet on Wednesday, November 30 at 7:30pm to discuss The Mothers and Daughters of the Bible Speak by Shannon Bream - this is the same author of the book, Women of the Bible Speak, which we read earlier in the year. All are invited to join us.

"Have faith" is a phrase we hear all the time. But what does it actually look like to live it out? In <u>The Mothers and</u> Daughters of the Bible Speak, Shannon

Bream examines the lives of biblical women to see how God's plans can turn our worlds upside down.

Through stories, Shannon Bream explains the intimate connection between faith and family—and how God's unexpected agenda can redefine the way



we think about family. Not all of these mothers and daughters in the Bible were paragons of virtue. Like us, they were human beings who faltered and struggled to do their best. While some heard God's voice, others chose their own paths. Through the lens of their imperfections, we can see how God used their stories to bring about His divine plans. He's still doing the same work in our lives today.

The Mothers and Daughters of the Bible Speak shows that faith is more often a twisting road than a straight

line. Yet, as the stories of biblical families attest, at the end of these journeys lies greater peace and joy than we could ever imagine.

CFPA is the only agency in the entire state sanctioned to provide its combined services of Domestic Violence, Sexual Abuse/Assault, Human Trafficking, Adult Protective Services, and Prevention Education under one roof. CFPA operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year, and all victim services are free and confidential.

Funded entirely through community donations, Almost Home Kids is a 12-bedroom, 21,000-square-foot home. AHK provides compassionate, competent care to children from birth to age 21 who have complex medical needs. Often they are dependent on medical technology such as ventilators, tracheostomy tubes, G-tubes, central lines or oxygen. Almost Home Kids has served children with over 400 different diagnoses.

# **Food Preparations**

Fixing meals and eating with family is a part of many holiday celebrations. Here are some tips to help prevent food poisoning, or food borne illness, during the holidays.

- · Keep foods separated. Beef, chicken, turkey, seafood, and eggs should be separate from all other foods at the grocery store and in the refrigerator. Prevent juices from meat, chicken, turkey, and seafood from dripping or leaking onto other foods by keeping them in containers or sealed plastic bags.
- · Cook food thoroughly. Meat, chicken, turkey, seafood, and eggs can carry germs that cause food poisoning. Use a food thermometer to ensure these foods have been cooked to a safe internal temperature.
- · **Keep food out of the "danger zone."** After food is prepared, keep hot food hot and cold food cold. Refrigerate or freeze any perishable food within 2 hours (1 hour if food is exposed to temperatures above 90°F). The temperature in your refrigerator should be set at or below 40°F and the freezer at or
- · Use pasteurized eggs for dishes containing raw eggs, such as eggnog, tiramisu, hollandaise sauce, and Caesar dressing.
- · Do not eat raw dough or batter. Dough and batter made with flour or eggs can contain harmful germs, such as E. coli and Salmonella. Do not taste or eat raw dough or batter that is meant to be baked or cooked. Some companies and stores offer edible cookie dough that uses heat-treated flour and pasteurized eggs or no eggs. Read the label carefully to make sure the dough is meant to be eaten without baking or cooking.
- Thaw your turkey safely; thaw in the refrigerator, in a sink of cold water (change the water every 30 minutes), or in the microwave.
- · Wash your hands with soap and water during times when you are likely to get and spread germs. Wash your hands before, during, and after preparing food as well as before eating.
