

he disciples asked Jesus, Lord, teach us to pray as John taught his disciples. This resulted in Jesus sharing what Father Tim, from the Mitford Series novels, refers to as "the prayer that never fails." They are words of Jesus and a model for how we are to pray. It is a prayer that reminds us that we are brothers and sisters in faith as we pray to "our Father in heaven." We pray this prayer often and in many contexts, but this Lent, we will take a deeper look into these heartfelt words that are foundational in our relationship with our heavenly Father and how praying together unites us in ministry and mission.

As this year unfolds and we **Engage God's Mission with Hope for the Future**, I invite you into prayerful discernment about our future together. What is God's mission for us? How will we know the direction? Who needs to hear and experience the love of God and how are we being called to engage in the work of the church together?

Thomas said to Jesus, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How will we know the way?" Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life." Empowered by God's Spirit, we are the body of Christ and workers in God's kingdom. We are united not because of what we do but because of who God in Christ has made us to be, images of God and brothers and sisters in faith.

Weekly themes will shape mid-week Wednesday services as we worship and pray our way through 40 days of discernment beginning with Ash Wednesday, February 22. Services will be at 11am and 6:30pm with a light lunch available following the mid-day service beginning March 1.

Who are we and what will we become? Lord only knows, but I am confident the vision will become clearer as we engage God's mission together.



Sleep Health

While the needed amount varies, getting enough sleep is important for individuals of all ages to maintain good health. We often cut back on sleep for work, family needs, or to just watch a good television program. If not getting enough sleep is a regular part of your routine, you may be at an increased risk for obesity, type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease and stroke, as well as poor mental health. Just one night of insufficient sleep can affect you the next day – you are more likely to feel drowsy, be in a bad mood, be less productive at work, or be involved in some type of accident.

Some habits to help improve your sleep include:

- · Be consistent. Go to bed and get up at the same time, including the weekends.
- · Your bedroom should be quiet, dark, relaxing, and at a comfortable temperature.
- · Eliminate electronic devices and televisions in the bedroom.
- · Avoid large meals, caffeine, and alcohol before bedtime.
- · Exercise. Being physically active during the day can help you fall asleep more easily at night.

Getting enough sleep is important, but good sleep quality is also essential. Signs of poor sleep quality include feeling sleepy or tired even after getting enough sleep, repeatedly waking up during the night, and having symptoms of a sleep disorder (such as snoring or gasping for air). If you have symptoms of a sleep disorder, such as snoring or being very sleepy during the day after a full night's sleep, make sure to tell your doctor.
