ith fall comes the process of reflecting on what has been, the previous three-fourths of the year and the plans and visions for the next year ahead. Later in October, you will receive a mailing from Salem with some highlights of ways your gifts of support have helped define and live out the mission of the church to grow people in Christ to love and serve others. You will also be invited to make a pledge of support for current and future ministry opportunities as together we learn and grow together through God's word. Now, nearly three-fourths through this budget year, many might wonder where we stand financially. Some of this information will be more fully spelled out in the stewardship material that will be sent through a separate mailing but for now, this is what we know.

- 1. At the end of August, year-to-date (YTD) giving totaled \$362,000 versus a budget of \$336,800 resulting in \$25,300 better than YTD budget.
- 2. Total Expenses related to giving is right on target through 8 months at 67%
- 3. Total Cash on-hand less dedicated obligations leaves \$56,800 operating cash available.
- 4. Thanks to many generous gifts, the current balance of our construction loan with Mission Investment Fund (MIF) is now only \$103,000 along with the \$200,000 owed to Endowment. This means that in just five years, you not only supported the general ministry expenses but have additionally given over \$3 million toward the Capital Appeal! That's amazing! The finish line of loaned debt is within our reach. Just imagine what we will be able to do once these two remaining balances are paid in full and we can then focus all our financial giving to support to the mission of making Christ known at and beyond Salem.

Wouldn't it be a great way to celebrate 140 years of ministry by paying off our financial obligation at least to the MIF loan, then pay off the Endowment Fund loan in 2024 and begin working to grow into a future with hope for what is next to come? We are blessed to be part of a generous congregation. When needs are identified, you step forward to meet and exceed expectations. Generosity is a gift from God. It is a response in returning a portion of what is entrusted to us in thanksgiving to God and hope of making a difference for others. So, I invite you to pray, dream, envision what is yet to come and prepare to renew and further extend your pledge of support to help fulfill those hopes and dreams as we invite God to bless what has prepared us to grow and serve faithfully together. Salem has supported the Equal Exchange Fair Trade Program for more than 22 years! We thank you for continuing to empower small farmers and cooperatives around the world with your Fair Trade purchases. Equal Exchange works directly with these partners to give the best price possible for their goods while minimizing the impact to the environment.


Equal Exchange does not aim to maximize profits. They generally make around 2-5% profit and share some of these modest returns with worker-owners and investors who help to finance our mission in an increasingly consolidated food system. At Salem, we sell items at cost so that we can keep prices low while supporting the Fair Trade ministry to make a difference around the world.

Unfortunately, the cost of packaging, transport, green coffee, and other agricultural products have all gone up. Our prices will be increasing in October. This is mainly affecting coffee and cocoa products at the moment and there will be some slight increases with other products. We will still offer items at the wholesale cost that Equal Exchange offers to its faith partners.

Join Salem members for Book Club Night! We will be meeting via Zoom on Wednesday, October 25 at 7:30pm - 8:30pm to discuss "Take this Bread" by Sara

Early one morning, for no earthly reason, Sara Miles, raised an atheist, wandered into a church, received communion, and found herself transformed-embracing a faith she'd once scorned. A left-wing journalist who'd covered revolutions around the world, Miles didn't discover a religion that was about angels or good behavior or piety; her faith centered on real hunger, real food, and real bodies. Before long, she turned the bread she ate at communion into tons of groceries, piled on the church's altar to be given away. Within a few years, she and the people she served had started nearly a dozen food pantries in the poorest parts of their city. Take This Bread is rich with real-life Dickensian characters-church ladies, millionaires, schizophrenics, bishops, and thieves-all blown into Miles's life by the relentless

force of her newfound calling. Here, in this achingly beautiful, passionate book, is the living communion of Christ.

Sara Miles is the author of How to Hack a Party Line: The Democrats and Silicon Valley and co-editor of Directed by Desire: The Collected Poems of June Jordan. Her work has appeared in *The New York Times Magazine*, The New Yorker, The Progressive, La Jornada, and Salon, among others. She has written extensively on military affairs, politics, and culture. She lives in San Francisco with her family.

Philippians: Books of Faith

Explore the book of Philippians through historical, literary, Lutheran, and devotional lenses using Brenda Ihssen's Philippians Learner Guide. Philippians is a letter from Paul to the community of faith in Philippi, which supported Paul's ministry. Paul writes from prison to reassure the Philippians that his ministry continues despite his situation. This four-session study uses four paradoxes as lenses to look at Paul's letter which is useful for both those new in the study of scripture as well as seasoned learners who are looking for opportunities to deepen and expand their engagement with the Bible. The study and discussion will be led by Pastor Craig.

Elisabeth Elliot: A Life, by Lucy S.R. Austen (B ELL)

Elisabeth Elliot (1926-2015) is one of the most widely known Christians of the twentieth and twentyfirst centuries. After the death of her husband, Jim, and four other missionaries at the hands of Waorani tribesmen in Ecuador, Elliot famously returned to live among the same people who had killed her husband. Her legacy, however, extends far beyond these events. In the years that followed, Elliot became a prolific writer and speaker, touching the lives of countless people around the world.

In this single-volume biography, Lucy S. R. Austen takes readers on an in-depth journey through the life of Elisabeth Elliot her birth to missionary parents, her courtship and marriage to Jim Elliot, her missions work in Ecuador, and her private life and public work after she returned to the United States. Through Elliot's example of love for God and obedience to his commands, readers will ponder what it means to follow Jesus.

BLESS: 5 Everyday Ways to Love Your Neighbor and Change the World by Dave Ferguson, Jon Ferguson (248.4 FER)

BLESS is a simple, biblical, and relational set of 5 practices that everyone—young and old—can use every day to reach their neighbors, show them love, and change their world! From the beginning of the Bible, God has spoken of blessing. Throughout the gospels, Jesus blessed others through his life and leadership. This book will break down the Bless principles, and help Christians engage in a relational form of evangelism. Readers will learn the five practices of BLESS.



- Begin (with prayer) to discover your personal mission
- Listen to others
- Eat with others and build the relationship
- Serve others
- Tell you Story. By establishing a relationship, and investing in others, opportunities will arise to share your story of God's influence upon your life.

FROM THE PARISH NURSE, LORI REIMER

When we hear about a health condition, whether our own or a loved ones, many of us quickly "Google" the disease, condition, or medication. If you do this, you often go away more confused or believing and passing on misinformation. While researching conditions and medicines does make you a great advocate in your own health care, not everything you read online is fact. Here are a few tips when looking online for accurate, helpful health information:

- Consider the source use recognized authorities such as a .gov, .org or .edu
- Look at the "home page" or find the "about us" page to see who runs the site
- Look for evidence look for research, not opinion; who wrote the information a health professional or someone who developed the page after experiencing the health condition
- Check how current the information is
- Beware that the site is not just an advertisement for a product
- Protect your privacy when asked to take online surveys, etc
- Consult with your health professional about information that you have learned
- Also be aware of health scams that could include "miracle" drugs and cures.
