The Ulrich family has a rich history with Salem. Luke's grandmother, Elizabeth, and mother, Lois, were active members and Luke was confirmed at Salem. In the summer of 2015, Luke and Jamie visited Salem and announced their family would become missionaries to Africa. They have served in Malawi, a very poor country in east Africa for eight years. Salem has had the privilege of helping support their ministry.

Luke and Jamie have focused particularly on the poor children including many orphans. They raised their own funding and learned the native language as few of those they ministered to knew English. They taught, shared God's Love and Word, and helped establish businesses to help fund the ministry. Jamie produced a Sunday School curriculum in the native language.

Luke and Jamie Ulrich have served God in many wonderful ways and are now coming home to get reestablished in the United States. They will be visiting Salem during the service on **Sunday, July 21** and will host a special luncheon after the service.

NOISY CAN OFFERINGS IN JUNE AND JULY

Companion Synods on Sunday, June 9

The Central/Southern Illinois Synod has a companion synod relationship with two synods of the Malagasy Lutheran Church. The Ambovombe-Androy Synod and Faradofay Synod are located in southern Madagascar and have approximately 40 pastors who serve 60 congregations with 30,000 baptized members. At the Synod Assembly Festival worship each year, the C/SIS gathers offerings that help support the ministry of these synods.

Companion synod relationships are rooted in "accompaniment," which promotes the values of mutuality, inclusivity, vulnerability, empowerment, and sustainability. Companion synods nurture and strengthen one another for life and ministry through prayer, study, communication, exchange of visitors and sharing of resources. The relationships enrich and deepen our ministries by exposing us to global challenges and perspectives as we seek to work with one another to build up the body of Christ and the world. 


Fair Trade


How to Grow: Applying the Gospel to all of Your Life by Darryl Dash - (248.4 DAS)

Faith Formation for All Ages this Summer

"Great are the works of the LORD, studied by all who delight in them." Psalm 111:2

Faith Formation is talking faith and science this summer! It seems we find ourselves, children and adults, presented with something of a false choice: to believe in God or to believe in the work of science. Perhaps we need to consider a third choice: to let God inspire our love of science and to let science deepen our wonder and awe of God! We are going to do this with two books, Stars Beneath Us by Paul Wallace and Scientists of Faith by Christy Monson and illustrated by William Luong.

Samples of these books will be available for you to look at this summer at the Welcome Center.

• Stars Beneath Us is a short, but very thought provoking discussion of faith and science with Biblical texts woven throughout and the author's personal perspective.

• Scientists of Faith presents itself as a children's book. However, upon closer inspection it most definitely is not! Presenting 28 stores of brilliant scientists, some familiar and some probably not, with remarkable faith in God, you will discover that your love of God and God's wondrous creation is only deepened by scientific curiosity. This book is for all ages!

Our book is, The Stars Beneath Us – Finding God in the Evolving Cosmos, by Paul Wallace. It is available in paperback and Kindle.

This book brilliantly shows God's presence in the ever-evolving cosmos. Relying on his upbringing as a Baptist, his doctoral work in experimental nuclear and gamma-ray astronomy, and his ordination to the gospel ministry, Weaver weaves a book unlike any other in faith-and-science literature. This is a call to courage for those who fear a true encounter with the cosmos will distance them from God. Stars Beneath Us will inspire readers to engage with the natural world in new ways, and find God, as it turns out, is everywhere.

"If you're tired of debates that pit the Bible against science or bored of arguments over the compatibility between Genesis and evolution - and yet remain convinced that we have much yet to learn about the positive relationship between science and faith - Paul Wallace's Stars Beneath Us is the next book for you to read. In July, Salem Lutheran Church will be represented by students, Isaac Hartman, Brianna Schroeder, Makayla Schroeder, Micah Thompson and two adult leaders, Laura Hartman and Amy Schroeder at the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans. The Gathering theme, "Created to Be," highlights the arts, music and soul of beautiful, vibrant and resilient New Orleans. This will be the first youth gathering since 2018 – youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. This week long experience will include days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship. Young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives.

During the Gathering, youth and their leaders plan to dive deeper into justice, mental health and anti-racism conversations. These are hard conversations, but our church desperately needs to have them. We also hope to foster relationships and be a sanctuary for one another. We are saint and sinner simultaneously, and we need forgiveness when we aren't or can't be brave, authentic, free, disruptive disciples.

Young Lutherans have been gathering for more than 100 years! The Lutheran denominations that made up the ELCA each had rich traditions of bringing their young people together. We've gathered in places from Los Angeles to Boston under such themes as "Called to Freedom" and "Jesus, Justice, Jazz," with speakers from Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. to Bishop Desmond Tutu. You are encouraged to pray for these youth and leaders that they affirm and are challenged in their faith, experience new perspectives, ponder their vocation, bond with their peers, and learn more about the ELCA and their partners.

FROM THE PARISH NURSE, LORI REIMER

Each June, Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month is recognized as a time to raise awareness about Alzheimer's disease and other dementias, as well as those who care for them.

As both a family and professional caregiver, I have learned that one of the most important things you can do is take care of yourself- both physically and mentally. Ways to do this include:

- include meals, sitting with the care recipient, helping with appointments, and more.
- Utilize services from home health or adult day services when needed.
- Join a caregiver support group.
- Take breaks each day.
- Spend time with your friends.
- Keep up with your hobbies and interests.
- illness or emergency situation.
- Eat healthy, exercise as often as you can, and see your own doctor on a regular basis.

Most caregivers have trouble asking for help and taking care of themselves. As the care recipient needs change, so will the caregivers. As a friend or family member, ask what you can do to help. Let the caregiver know what tasks you are comfortable with or able to do. For more information, check out resources in the Parish Nurse office.


