The verse of the week from a recent daily Bible app struck a chord with me.

"We can make our plans, but the LORD determines our steps." - Proverbs 16:9

As I reflected on this verse, I was reminded that while it is important to plan and prepare for the future, it is equally important to remember that God guides and directs the steps of the plans that bring honor and glory to God.

In his first letter to the Corinthians, Paul reminded fellow believers, "I planted the seed in your hearts, and Apollos watered it, but it was God who made it grow." – 1 Corinthians 3:6. Paul knew that his mission was not to draw attention to himself. He had tried his plan before, but Jesus intervened and set him on a new path to proclaim the good news message of Jesus and rejoice when he saw it growing in ways that changed hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. That was and remains the purpose, growing people in Christ. That's the heart of Salem's mission - worship, education, service, fellowship, prayer - we are a community whose main purpose is to grow in faith and intentionally point others to the joy and fulfillment of knowing God's greatest expression of love revealed to us through Jesus.

Ministry plans are beginning to unfold as we turn the corner toward fall programming. We plan but it is important to remember who guides our steps and provides the growth.

To quote 18th-century poet Robert Burns, "The best laid plans of mice and men often go awry." It is true that there are times when, even with best intentions, things do not go as planned. When that is the case, we re-assess, re-plan, re-center our hearts on God's purposes, our mission and try again.

So grab a towel, comb, nail clippers, soap and toothbrush, wrap them up and send them off to provide care for someone in need and do it for Jesus. Sing a song in worship and sing it for Jesus. Teach a lesson, share time with someone you just met, pray, laugh, cry, listen, learn and do it in the name of Jesus. Jesus changes lives, yours as well as others. Try something new and try it for Jesus.

A prayer of new beginnings was offered in worship August 11. As we begin this new season of life together. It is exciting to anticipate the unfolding of plans as together we pray for God's blessing to see growth that we hope will result. Pray with me using the words of a Moravian prayer focused on the journey ahead.

God of new beginnings, we confess, we are not always excited about another new song, another adjustment, another change! So, please open our hearts to the new song the Spirit may be inviting today. May singing it help us be it. Amen.






SALEM BOOK CLUB FELLOWSHIP & CONVERSATION

Join us on **September 25 at 7:30pm via Zoom** when we discuss the best-selling book by beloved writer, Henri Nouwen, The Return of the Prodigal Son. Nouwen was inspired to write this classic book about grable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32) after viewing and meditating

the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32) after viewing and meditating for a week in front of the painting by Rembrandt, The Return of the Prodigal Son, that hangs in The Hermitage in St. Petersburg, Russia. Rembrandt's painting is a renowned work described by Kenneth Clark as "a picture which those who have seen the original in St. Petersburg may be forgiven for claiming as the greatest picture ever painted." You will not want to miss reading this book and joining the discussion as we meditate on the larger-than-life painting and discuss Nouwen's book. This was Nouwen's personal favorite book that he wrote.



Nouwen was a Dutch-born Catholic priest, professor, psychologist, and prolific writer. He taught psychology at the University of Notre Dame and pastoral theology at the Divinity Schools of Yale and Harvard before leaving academia to become the pastor at L'Arche Daybreak, a community for people with intellectual disabilities. A master communicator, Nouwen wrote and spoke with great openness and vulnerability about faith, spiritual formation, prayer, social justice, and other themes related to the spiritual life, He wrote thirty-nine books that sold over one million copies in his lifetime and were translated into more than thirty-five languages.

A chance encounter with a reproduction of Rembrandt's, The Return of the Prodigal Son, catapulted Nouwen on an unforgettable spiritual adventure. He shares the deeply person and resonant meditation that led him to discover the place within where God has chosen to dwell. Identifying with each of the three main figures in the painting, Nouwen crafts a fresh interpretation of the parable, concluding: "Though I am both the younger son and the elder son, I am not to remain them, but called to become the Father." Ultimately, this book expresses all Nouwen wanted to say about love.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE PARISH NURSE, LORI REIMER

September is **Sepsis Awareness** month. You may have heard of sepsis but not understand what it is or how it could affect you. Not only is it the leading cause of readmissions to the hospital, but it is also the leading cause of death in the hospital. Most of the cases though do not originate in the hospital, rather out in the community. According to Sepsis Alliance, sepsis is defined as the body's overwhelming and life-threatening response to infection, which can lead to tissue damage, organ failure, and death. Any infection, from the smallest (bug bite, hangnail) to the more severe (pneumonia, meningitis, and more) can lead to sepsis and septic shock. Those with the highest risk of developing sepsis include infants and seniors as well as those with chronic or serious illnesses. The risk of sepsis can be reduced by preventing or quickly identifying and managing infections. This includes good hygiene, current vaccinations, and seeking treatment when you suspect an infection.

Remember **TIME** when identifying symptoms:

- Temperature (higher or lower than normal),
- Infection,
- Mental decline (confused or sleepy), and
- Extremely ill

If you suspect sepsis, see medical help immediately. For additional information on sepsis go to sepsis.org.
