

Hello, Salem Family!

Thank you for your support on my mission trip to Ethiopia over the week of 10/19 – 10/26. In Ethiopia, I was introduced to people both young and old. Some of these people were school children who were provided the opportunity to escape their circumstances through learning. Others lived in Kora (a trash dump) and made their living off of looking through trash. And yet others were artisans who crafted fine, handmade products to support themselves and others. Granted, these were not all of the people I had the opportunity to meet, but all of them had one important characteristic in common.

They were all God's children. All were touched by someone who God spoke to. These people God spoke to had the opportunity to focus on only bettering themselves, while forgetting about others less fortunate. However, I am convinced God spoke to them, moved them, and brought the love of God to their hearts to care and love for these people. The reason I am convinced is who would commit to feeding hearty meals to school children on the top of a mountain every Thursday year-round just because? Why would someone choose to feed nutritious meals to the prostitutes in Kora once a month just because? Why would people start businesses employing artisans and using that business to support others who lack the opportunity to escape their circumstances? People even do it around Peoria, such as Salem supporting the C.T. Vivian elementary school. With your support, I was able to witness these stories and gain an understanding of God's love I never thought I would. If you are planning a gift to offset 2024 income, you'll want to be aware of the official rules from the IRS: "Donors must deliver or mail checks on or by **December 31, 2024,** in order to claim a charitable contribution deduction for 2024. Checks that are placed in the church offering on the first Sunday of 2025 will not qualify for a charitable contribution deduction in 2024, even if the check is pre-dated to 2024 or was actually written in 2024. However, checks that are written, mailed and post-marked in 2024 will be deductible in 2024 though they are not received by a church until 2025." Thank you for keeping these things in mind as you plan your giving.
