### **Monthly News from Salem Lutheran Church**



"A sower went out to sow..." Matthew, Mark, and Luke tell the story of the sower who does what he is supposed to do, sow seeds. The sower is not responsible for how that seed will grow or produce, only that the sower knows that the seed will not grow in the bag but must connect with soil before it can bring forth life and the opportunity of producing a harvest. Spring in the Midwest is time for sowing and plantings. Clouds of dust are rolling across open fields as tractors pull large implements to stir the soil and prepare the seed bed and then embed seed in long, straight rows as far as the eye can see. It is a regular pattern that occurs every spring. Planting in hope for a harvest. At the same time, home gardeners prepare soil for what they hope will produce fruit, vegetables, or areas of plants as a natural habitat to benefit pollinators and other wildlife. We are partners in God's creation, regardless how we dig in the dirt and for whatever life that takes root around us. It is an exciting time of life as we anticipate the possibilities of what is yet to come as new and abundant life.

From a resource I helped write over 30 years ago entitled, Worship from the Ground Up, "We frequently think of seedtime, planting, and prayers for an abundant harvest as the main emphasis of rogation, but the word 'rogation' actually takes its meaning from the Latin word 'rogare' which means 'to beseech'. From the 5th century, the bishop of France required a three-day observance consisting of forgiveness, protection, bountiful crops. Over the years, the penitent emphasis has fallen away leaving the focus on festivity including blessing of the fields with the hope of a bountiful harvest." Customarily, Rogation Sunday is the Sixth Sunday of Easter, but overtime, with advanced genetics for seeds, earlier spring conditions, planting takes place far earlier than decades ago. I invite us into a time of rogation on Sunday, May 4 where we will ask God's blessing on soil, seed and water as well as seek God's forgiveness where we have failed to partner with our Creator by neglect or abuse of the earth's resources and to beseech God to protect us from the risk of natural devastation.




## Taste and See by Margaret Feinberg

This groundbreaking book provides a culinary exploration of Scripture.
